We have a lot of news for you this month. The SHTA Board has selected a new Executive Director to lead the organization. Registration for Hike Fest 2017 is underway.

Supporting retailers are hosting spring events for those of you looking for new gear! The North Shore is finally seeing signs of spring and many eager hikers are anxiously waiting to get out on the trail. Trail crews are starting to clear the winter damage and volunteers are doing section and campsite maintenance checks.

Trail Conditions:

Early spring conditions including wet and muddy stretches on the southern sections to knee deep snow on northern sections. Trail may be blocked in some areas by winter blow-down or sagging brush. Far northern access roads (Jackson Lake Road and Otter Lake Road) may be difficult. Although it may not last hikers should remember that late season snow can fall well into May!

SHTA HIRES NEW EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

The Superior Hiking Trail Association (SHTA) has hired a new executive director. After a four-month

search, the SHTA is pleased to announce that Denny Caneff will lead the SHTA into the future of maintaining, improving, permanently securing and protecting the trail as well as securing financial resources to support the SHTA and cultivating membership.

"We are fortunate to have found a leader with Denny's depth of experience and dynamic personality," said Tim Kuehn, vice president of the SHTA Board of Directors and chair of the SHTA Executive Director Search Committee, which received more than 70 applications for the executive director position. "With this summer's completion of the trail, the association's focus and needs are broadening. We not only chose Denny for his passion for the outdoors but his big picture thinking and strategic skills and his ability to build relationships with stakeholders. These skills will be key in setting the future direction of the trail for years to come."

Denny comes to the North Shore by way of Madison, Wisc., where he held professional positions in land and water conservation, mostly recently completing a 13-year stint as executive director of the River Alliance of Wisconsin. His work at the River Alliance was honored with two recent awards: the "Conservation in Action" award from the Wisconsin League of Conservation Voters, and a "River Hero" award from the national river conservation organization River Network. As a long-time nonprofit executive and consultant, Denny has raised tens of millions of dollars in grants and donations, developed volunteer and board capacity, managed professional staff, shaped conservation policy and educated the public on complex issues.

"I'm really excited to bring my nonprofit management experience and passion for the outdoors and conservation to the Superior Hiking Trail Association," Denny said. "The North Shore has always drawn me in, and what better way to answer that call than this work to keep the Superior Hiking Trail a regional and national gem."

A Minnesota native, Denny was born and raised in Hastings. He's a graduate of St. Cloud State University and holds a master's degree in journalism from the University of Wisconsin-Madison. The father of four children, Denny is an avid kayaker and hiker, and has canoed the entire length of the Mississippi River. Well-traveled, he has spent time in over 20 foreign countries, and served in the Peace Corps in West Africa. When he is not on a trail or river, Denny loves to be in his kitchen cooking and sharing those creations with friends.

Members and hikers attending Hike Fest 2017 on May 19-21 will have an opportunity to meet and welcome Denny where he will be formally introduced to the association on Saturday. Denny will start his work on June 1.

SHTA Partners with Midwest Mountaineering for Grant

PATAGONIA AWARDS \$5000 FOR HABITAT AND TRAIL RESTORATION ON THE SPLIT ROCK RIVER LOOP

This much-loved 5-mile segment of trail has been severely impacted by the combination of growing numbers of trail users and riverbank erosion as a result of the changing pattern of heavy rain events. The worn trail presents both safety concerns for trail users and a pathway for increased sediment to be released into the river and lake.

The project proposal includes using native plants to restore disturbed soils and stabilize trail structures, replacement of rock steps, the addition of water bars to move water off the trail, re-benching areas of treadway to improve drainage, and re-routing the trail in an area subject to frequent flooding.
